### **SCHOOL MADE AYP FOR 2 OR MORE YEARS CONSECUTIVELY**

For 2010-2011, Lakeview Elementary made Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) in English language arts and mathematics. While we are pleased to have reached this important goal, we are continuously working to improve. We appreciate the continued support of parents, staff and our community in this effort.

### **PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL**

For the 2010-11 school year, students in grades 1-4 were assigned to attend Lakeview Elementary School, as it is the only building in the district housing these grade levels.

For the 2009-10 and 2010-11 school years the school improvement plan, as well as the professional development plan are created in conjunction with each other to compliment the improvement of our school. Staff also completed the newly required School Data Profile and Analysis for the Comprehensive Needs Assessment.

Lakeview Elementary serves as a traditional Elementary School housing all 1-4 students, as our district does not offer specialized school opportunities.

Lakeview Elementary offers access to the core curriculum through the building principal via the school district's curriculum folders via the district electronic warehouse. The core curriculum, created by the State of Michigan is followed and implemented in all classrooms at Lakeview Elementary. There is no content variance from the state model; however the core curriculum has been clarified by school staff for shared understanding amongst staff and stakeholders. Staff began the process of "unpacking and aligning" the new National Common Core Standards with the current curriculum grade level content expectations as well in order to prepare staff to teach the forthcoming National curriculum.

Lakeview Elementary strives to make 100% percent contact with all families at least twice a school year during the scheduled parent-teacher conference times. Percentages of our past two school years are as follows:
